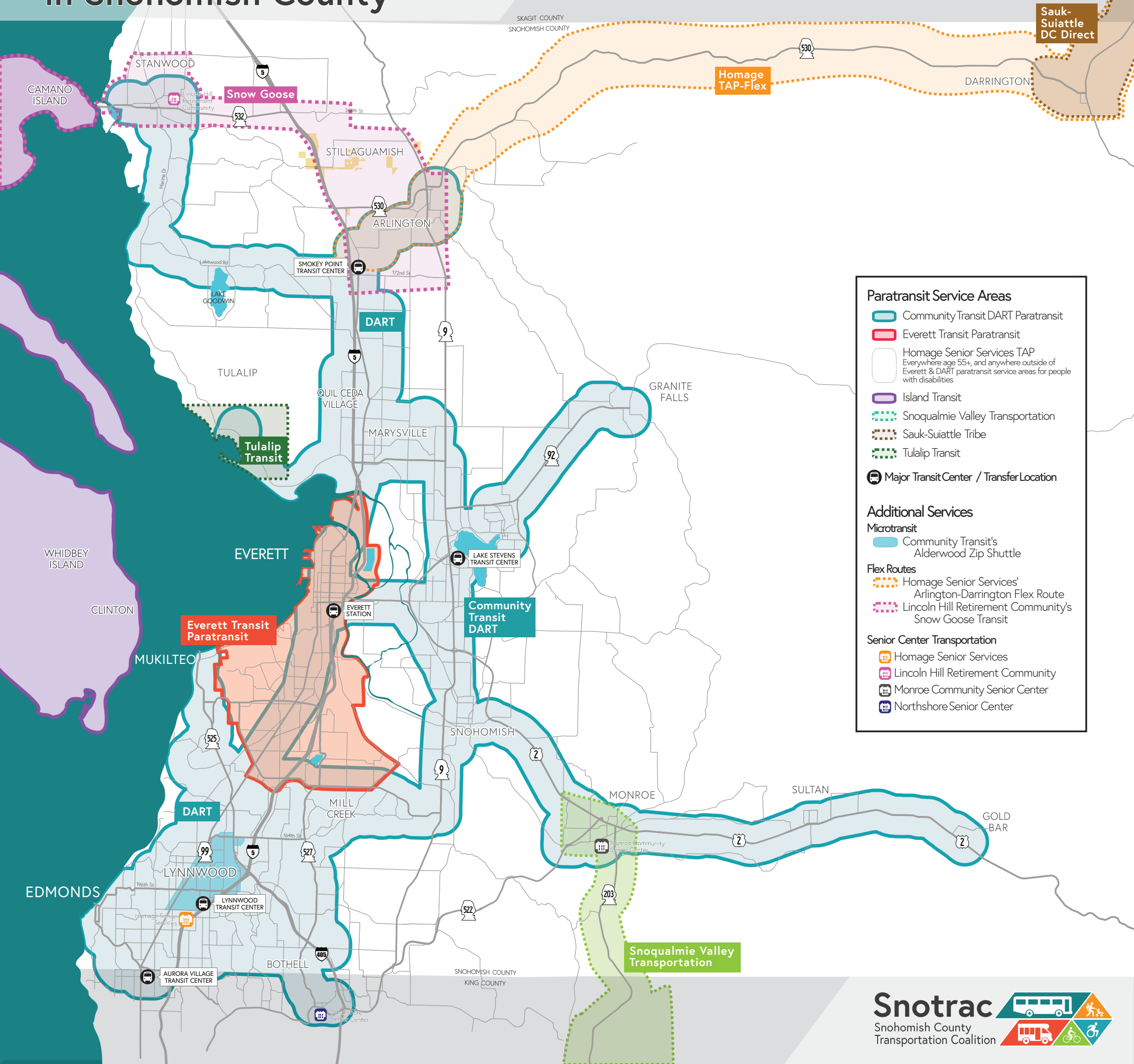

Community Transit

Fixed Bus Routes

Community Transit operates more than 50 fixed bus routes for communities within its designated tax district, including the *Swift* bus rapid transit routes, commuter and local bus routes, and Sound Transit's express routes.

DART Paratransit

People with disabilities who are verified to be eligible by the agency can ride DART for door-to-door trips within 3/4ths of a mile of Community Transit's fixed bus routes. Trips can be scheduled by phone or app, the day prior to the trip.

DART can also coordinate with and connect riders to King County Metro's ACCESS Paratransit, Everett Transit's Paratransit, and Homage's TAP, and other mobility services.

Alderwood Zip Shuttle

Zip is an on-demand, door-to-door service to travel anywhere within the Alderwood area. There are no special eligibility requirements, and trips can be scheduled by phone or app 15-minutes prior to the trip.

Island Transit, DC Direct, and Tulalip Transit have zero fares.
Snow Goose Transit and Monroe-Duval Shuttle operate on a suggested donation basis.

Everett Transit

Fixed Bus Routes

Everett Transit operates 10 fixed bus routes transit within the City of Everett.

Paratransit

People with disabilities (who are verified to be eligible by Community Transit) and people age 65 & up can ride Everett Paratransit for door-to-door trips within the City of Everett. Trips can be scheduled by phone, the day prior to the trip.

Island & Skagit Transit

Island Transit operates fixed-route and paratransit buses on Whidbey and Camano Islands, and Skagit Transit operates fixed-route and paratransit buses in Skagit County. Both provide express bus services to Everett Station. With advance prior scheduling, Community Transit's DART can connect people to Island Transit's and Skagit Transit's paratransit services for cross-county door-to-door transportation.

Homage Senior Services

Transportation Assistance Program (TAP)

For door-to-door trips outside of the service areas of Community Transit and Everett Transit, people with disabilities can ride Homage's TAP. In addition, regardless of location, people age 55 & up and people with low incomes can ride TAP.

Arlington-Darrington Flex Route

For the general public, Homage operates two round-trip bus routes between Smokey Point and Darrington (and the Sauk-Suiattle Tribal Headquarters). The route complements Community Transit's Route 230, and can pick-up people off-route with prior scheduling.

Pay Your Pal

Rural residents who are disabled but cannot easily use DART or TAP may enroll in Homage's Pay Your Pal Program to reimburse a friend, family member, or neighbor to drive them where they need to go, up to an allotted number of miles.

Ethnic Senior Dining Transportation

Homage will drive elders to its weekly in-language lunches (noon) at its Lynnwood Multicultural Senior Center and Everett's Carl Gipson Center.

Meals on Wheels

People with disabilities and people age 60 & up who are homebound and unable to prepare meals can receive seven meals each week, delivered by Homage.

Snow Goose Transit

Open to the general public, Snow Goose Transit connects North Camano Island, Stanwood, and Smokey Point. Snow Goose operates on a fixed route, but people can call ahead to schedule a door-to-door pick-up/drop-off.

Sauk-Suiattle

DC Direct

Open to the general public, the DC Direct connects Darrington, the Sauk-Suiattle's HQ, and Concrete with a van shuttle that operates all day. Door-to-door service off of the fixed-route is possible with prior scheduling.

Open to the general public, the Snoqualmie Valley Transportation (SVT) connects Duval to Monroe. Limited off-route pickups are possible with prior scheduling.
